

This year marks the 23rd anniversary of Arpa International Film Festival, the signature event of the Arpa Foundation for Film, Music and Art (AFFMA), which will take place between November 12 – 22, 2020. We have an amazing and inspiring selection of 69 films from 20 countries from all over the world.

In consideration of the continuing challenges and uncertainty stemming from the Covid-19 pandemic, and per the extended federal and state guidelines, The Arpa IFF, which in the past has originally taken place at historic theaters around Hollywood, will take place online this year.

In the midst of our festival planning, having to relocate online created new and unexpected challenges for our team. This year, with the help of Seed&Spark, we worked very hard to make the transitional process easily accessible for our film audiences. While it was our hope to screen the films theatrically, streaming the films online will reach a greater viewership. From the comfort of your own home, people from all around the world can take part in our 23rd Annual Festival.

However, another international threat has affected communities across the globe and our Festival i.e., the war between Nagorno-Karabakh and Azerbaijan. The suffering of soldiers fighting for truth, honor and justice in Artsakh leaves a deep mark, not just on our Festival, but on humanity at large. Arpa International Film Festival has decided to donate all of its proceeds from the ticket sales to aid Artsakh.

For the last 23 years, we have come together to celebrate the art of film. During the selection process, our diligent team of festival programmers set aside time to meticulously select the finalists for this year's official selection from a large pool of films received this year. Opportunity always reveals itself to our filmmakers who have made it their mission in creating stories that move audiences and create undeniable emotion. This year's Arpa IFF will once again highlight a diverse range of world cinema that explores many contemporary issues.

With an all access pass, you and your family will be able to watch all 69 films, comprised of full length features, documentaries, short narrative films, short animated films and music videos, along with the Q&A's, panel discussions and closing night awards ceremony.

As always, we have several films made by Armenian filmmakers. Just to mention a few, we have two nominated music videos, MANOUG ME by Hamo Arzounmanian and ONLY LOVE by Eric Baziian.

Short Narrative Film, THIS LAND by Michael Aloyan and a short romantic comedy GIFTED, by Karina Weeks.

Nominated Feature documentary, AN ARMENIAN TRIOGY, tells the story the Composer Dan Yessian, who reconnects with his roots, writing a symphony in tribute to the 1.5 million souls lost in the Armenian Genocide. In the documentary, viewers have the opportunity to follow Yessian's journey to the ancestral homeland of Armenia. Yessian explores his own past and rediscovers Armenia's rich history, culture, and features the world-renowned Armenian Philharmonic Orchestra. The documentary asks the question: "How do you go home to a place you've never been to?"

Bared Moronian's new documentary, **BLOODLESS: THE PATH TO DEMOCRACY** is a riveting political thriller that captures the story of a revolution, as events unfold in the spring of 2018 in Armenia. In the course of history, only a few revolutions have been successful, let alone those without Bloodshed. Nikol Pashinyan, a charismatic former journalist and political prisoner, galvanized support among the youth and women by using non-violent civil disobedience protests and social media. In a short period of 6 weeks, a corrupt oligarchy was toppled and democracy restored. Bloodless recently won the "Audience Choice Award" from the Lunenburg Doc Fest of Canada and the 2020 Regional Emmy Nominee by NATAS Suncoast Chapter.

WHAT WILL BECOME OF US, is a nominated Feature-length Documentary, by Stephanie Ayanian and Joseph Myers, which follows six Armenian Americans as they navigate the 100th anniversary of the Genocide, forging identities for the next 100 years. Today, often unrecognized, it remains defining – but the long shadow of the Genocide creates a burden for young Armenian Americans that discourage them from taking up their culture.

We are happy to announce that this year we launched a platform for university students to submit their films to our film festival. Through our collaboration with the University of California, Irvine (UCI) Film Festival "ZotFest" where student filmmakers submitted their films, with the opportunity to showcase their creations beyond a university's vicinity. The intention behind our collaboration is to give a platform for upcoming student filmmakers, and we chose six films to screen at this year's festival.

Wherever you may be located, on your phone, tablet, laptop, computer or TV, alone or with your friends and family you can access our 2020 film lineup exclusively via the Seed&Spark platform.

You just need to create your free Seed&Spark account first - and the easiest way to create an account is to purchase our Festival Pass or any of the individual tickets. Everything is done at one page in one click – you just need to input your payment info (or your free festival pass coupon code if you've been provided one), first and last name, email and desired password – and Seed&Spark will create your account.

This is our Festival Program page with 69 films from 20 different countries, 18 Q&A sessions with filmmakers and one panel discussion, all separated into 3 major categories:

Our Festival Passes and individual tickets sales are up and running with Gold All-Access festival passes available for \$50 each (to view all 69 films), and individual film tickets at \$12 each. Naturally, you will have unlimited access to all feature-length films and all short blocks for 11 days straight during November 12-22, 2020. And we would like to mention that every Festival Pass purchase and ticket sale is helping Armenians in Artsakh now. Arpa International Film Festival has decided to donate all of its profits from the ticket sales to aid Artsakh. So please help us in supporting our festival this year by purchasing our festival passes and tickets. Profits will be matched by supporting companies to help Artsakh. We hope you enjoy our Festival Experience this year!

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

How do I watch a film? To watch a film, you can: purchase an individual ticket, purchase a pass, or re-deem an access code if you've been given one by the festival. If you make your purchase during the pre-order period, you'll need to wait until the festival starts to watch your film(s). You will be able to use your ticket or pass to watch the film(s) for the duration of the festival. Once the festival starts, select the title you want to watch from the Festival home page. If you have a pass or a ticket for the title selected, you can click "Watch" to begin viewing. Make sure you're logged into Seed&Spark with the e-mail that you used when making your purchase!

Where can I watch the film? You can watch the film on any Internet-connected device such as a computer, tablet, or phone (no downloads required!). You can also cast it on a TV. To watch on a TV, click play from the film page. Once the film player is open, hover your mouse over the bottom part of the frame to show icons that enable (Chromecast) or (Airplay).

As long as you have a Chromecast, Apple TV, or a Smart TV that supports either option, the icons should show up and the film should play on your TV.

How do I redeem an access or discount code? Codes can be redeemed during checkout. Make your purchase selection and enter your code in the "Coupon code" step on the checkout page. Please note that your code may be specific to individual tickets or passes only – in that case, your code will not work if you've selected a different product type.

I have a free access code. Do I still need to input my credit card information? Nope! At checkout, enter your free access code in the "Coupon code" field and click "Apply." And the credit card fields will disappear. Please note: If you opt to include a 10% donation to cover festival operational fees, you will need to input credit card information.

How can I purchase tickets for multiple films? Tickets must be purchased individually. Your access to all of the titles you've purchased tickets for is tied to your Seed&Spark account (using the e-mail and password that you set during checkout), so make sure you're logged in to watch! Alternatively, you can purchase a festival pass for access to all titles. 5

Arpa Foundation for Film, Music & Art (AFFMA) is a nonprofit organization founded in 1995 with the purpose of providing a platform for filmmakers, musicians and artists, whose works explore subjects of social and cultural importance. AFMMA's biggest endeavor was launching its signature Arpa International Film Festival (Arpa IFF) in 1997, which quickly came to be recognized as one of the leading indie film festivals in Southern California.

FESTIVAL MISSION

Arpa International Film Festival is dedicated to cultivating cultural understanding and global empathy by creating a dynamic forum for international cinema. Over the past 23 years, the festival has bridged cultural divides by fostering dialogue among people of diverse backgrounds. By showcasing local and international films that explore critical issues such as war, genocide, diaspora, dual identities, exile and multiculturalism, Arpa International Film Festival (Arpa IFF) has solidified its role in safeguarding films that continue to make a social impact.

FESTIVAL HISTORY

Arpa International Film Festival (Arpa IFF) was launched in 1997 by Sylvia Minassian with the support and encouragement of her husband. Since its inception, the festival has continuously embraced the diversity among local and international filmmakers.

The inaugural Arpa International Film Festival was held at the Alfred Hitchcock Theatre located at Universal Studios. Special guests included producers Hank Moonjean (Dangerous Liaisons, Beauty and the Beast) and Howard Kazanjian (Raiders of the Lost Ark, Star Wars: Return of the Jedi). The festival found a new home for several years at Raleigh Studios, one of the oldest studios in Hollywood, dating back to 1915. Equally historic, the Roosevelt Hotel was the location for the festival's Award Ceremonies. Arpa International Film Festival's rapid growth and popularity in 2003-2006 brought the festival to the Arclight Cinemas in Hollywood, with the Awards Gala taking place at the Universal Sheraton Hotel.

From 2006 to 2018 the Arpa International Film Festival (Arpa IFF) has been held at the world-renowned Egyptian Theatre in Hollywood until Netflix company purchased this historic venue.

Our big anniversary, the 20th Annual Awards Gala Banquet took place at the Loews Hollywood Hotel on November 5th, 2017. Honorees included music icon Chris Cornell (in memoriam), Oscar-winning director Terry George (The Promise, The Shore, Hotel Rwanda, In the Name of the Father), actor Carl Weathers (Rocky, Predator, Happy Gilmore) and Oscar-winning screenwriter Alexander Dinelaris (Birdman), with special performances by theremin virtuoso Armen Ra and vocalist Mister X.

In 2019 the 22nd Annual Arpa International Film Festival (Arpa IFF) was forced to find a new home and it was held at the historic American Legion Theater Hollywood Post 43, showcasing a dynamic set of films from around the world.

And 2020 brought a lot of changes indeed. We were ready to celebrate our festival's 23rd birthday at the AMC Sunset 5 Theatres in Hollywood when the Covid-19 pandemic hit the world. But we didn't want to just cancel our event - our filmmakers count on us to provide them with a platform to showcase their diverse work to our audience each year. Hence, we have decided to make our 23rd Annual Arpa International Film Festival (Arpa IFF) stand out this year and be available for streaming as a 11-Day Online Film Festival during November 12-22, 2020 via Seed&Spark platform.

Through the years, many industry greats have taken part in Arpa International Film Festival as honorees, presenters, emcees, special award recipients, and attendees. GABE SAPORTA Born in Uruguay and raised in New Jersey, Gabe Saporta is a musician and entrepreneur. For nearly ten years, he enjoyed multi-platinum success as the singer and creative force behind the band Cobra Starship. In 2016, Saporta and wife Erin Fetherston welcomed their first child. Wanting to spend more time with his family and less time in the spotlight, Saporta transitioned behind the scenes the following year and founded The Artist Group (T Δ G), a music management company. In 2018 he launched T Δ G MUSIC to provide full label and recording services for his clients. In 2019 T Δ G achieved more than 100 million streams with its first independent release, Tessa Violet's LP "Bad Ideas." In 2020 Saporta signed a global distribution deal with The Orchard to expand T Δ G music's radio presence and international reach. Saporta continues to grow T Δ G into a full service music company providing a wide range of management and label services for its clients, and, more importantly, guidance and stewardship in-line with the company ethos: "We believe creative expression is the cornerstone of self-realization and we feel privileged to be on that journey with our artists."



ANTHONY GRIECO is a 2015 Nicholl Award winner for his script Best Sellers. It was recently produced by Cassian and Arielle Elwes and stars Michael Caine and Aubrey Plaza. Anthony has had several scripts optioned, and eagerly awaits the start of production on his next script, a Buzz Aldrin biopic to be directed by Marc Forster. In addition, Anthony is a script consultant. He has worked as a Story Specialist for The Writers Store and a mentor for the Industry Insider Screenwriting Contest. He is also the co-writer of the screenwriting book The Pocket Screenwriting Guide: 120 Tips for Getting to Fade Out. Anthony moved to Los Angeles when one of his first spec screenplays was solicited by various agents and managers. Within months, he had optioned his first (co-written) feature, a comedy called I'm With Stupid, to Peachtree Films. Anthony attended the University of Toronto where he studied English and History. He later attended Circle in the Square Theatre School in New York City and went on to act in over 50 television commercials and episodic programs. In his spare time, Anthony is an amateur photographer (favorite subjects include Los Angeles architecture, his wife's cooking, and his cats Max and Buddy), film buff, collector of Criterion films, and frequent dinner party attendee.



ERIC NAZARIAN Born in Armenia and raised in Los Angeles, writer-directorproducer Eric Nazarian holds a Bachelor of Arts in Film Production from the University of Southern California's (USC) School of Cinematic Arts. He was awarded the prestigious Nicholl Fellowship in Screenwriting from the Academy of Motion Picture Arts & Sciences for his original screenplay, Giants. The Blue Hour, his first feature film as writer-director, world premiered In-Competition at the 55th San Sebastian International Film Festival in Spain and the Torino Film Festival, winning several awards on the international film festival circuit, including Best Director at the Arpa International Film Festival. Formerly a photojournalist, he has made films in Armenia, Mexico and Turkey. Nazarian wrote the period drama Three Christs with director-producer Jon Avnet, starring Richard Gere, Peter Dinklage, Julianna Margulies and Walton Goggins, based on the book by Milton Rokeach. The film's World Premiere was at the Toronto International Film Festival. IFC Films released the film in 2020. Nazarian is an inaugural fellow of the 20th Century Fox Writers Intensive Lab (FWI). A former fellow of the USC Institute of Armenian Studies, he has lectured on world cinema and the origins of silent film at university campuses in the U.S. and Europe.

KAREN KONDAZIAN'S career as an actor, author, journalist, and producer, started early in life... At the age of eight, Karen was chosen to be one of the infamous children on Art Linkletter's famous Kids Say the Darndest Things. The opportunity to miss school during tapings was all it took for Karen to abandon her life's goal of becoming a CIA spy and focus on acting. She was born in Boston, completing her education at The University of Vienna and The London Academy of Music and Dramatic Arts, after which she began her acting career in New York. Her first professional work was in the Off-Broadway, award-winning production of Michael Cacoyannis' The Trojan Women, later winning the Los Angeles Drama Critics Circle Award for Best Actress in The Rose Tattoo. Tennessee Williams, after seeing her work, was so impressed that he gave her carte blanche to produce any of his plays in his lifetime. Other award-winning performances include Sweet Bird of Youth (with Ed Harris), Vieux Carre (with Ray Stricklyn), and Maria Callas in Master Class. On television, she has appeared as a series regular lead in CBS's Shannon, and also guest-starred in over 50 television shows and films including James Dean (with James Franco) and Yes Giorgio (with Luciano Pavarotti) also playing Kate Holiday in David Wolper's award running series: Showdown at OK Corral. She is a lifetime member of the Actors Studio and a member of the Academy of Television Arts and Sciences. As an author, Kondazian is a multiaward winning novelist. Her debut novel, The Whip, won the USA News Book Award (Best Historical Fiction), Readers Favorite Award (Best Western Fiction), among other awards. The book was also featured on the cover of Publishers Weekly and is a screenplay. As a journalist, her long-running weekly column, Sculpting Your Career, appeared in BackStage, and Drama-Logue newspapers. Out of those columns, she created her first non-fiction book: The Actor's Encyclopedia of Casting Directors. Karen currently resides in Los Angeles, California, and is wo



ARA TAVITIAN, COMMUNITY LIAISON




LORENA DILANIAN, FESTIVAL ADVISOR
